1. INTRODUCTION

Basketball has long been recognized as a powerful tool for promoting physical fitness, teamwork, and fair play. However, in recent years, there has been growing recognition of the unique potential of basketball as a tool for social empowerment, particularly for young people facing social and economic challenges.

Our European project "Basket for All" on basketball as a tool for social empowerment is committed to leveraging the power of basketball to address social issues and promote positive social change. By providing young people with access to high-quality basketball programs and opportunities, we aim to support their physical and emotional well-being, enhance their life skills, and empower them to become active and engaged members of their communities.

To achieve these goals, it is essential that we establish and maintain high standards of quality throughout every aspect of the project. This quality standards document outlines the key quality standards that will guide our work, from the design and implementation of basketball programs to the evaluation of outcomes and impact.

These standards are grounded in best practices and research from the fields of sport, education, and social development. They reflect our commitment to providing young people with safe, inclusive, and high-quality basketball experiences that support their personal and social growth.

By adhering to these quality standards, we will ensure that our basketball programs are effective, sustainable, and impactful, and that they contribute to the overall success of the project. We are confident that by working together and striving for excellence in everything we do, we can achieve our shared vision of using basketball as a tool for social empowerment and positive change.



2. WHAT IS A QUALITY STANDARDS DOCUMENT?

Ensuring the QUALITY of a project means meeting the standards and deliverables set out at the beginning of the project. Therefore, managing the quality of the project means assessing its deliverables throughout the project lifecycle on a continuous basis. For this to be achieved, a Project Quality and Evaluation Plan is needed, which will identify the relevant quality standards and requirements to be fulfilled for achieving the deliverables and will create a plan for how to meet these requirements.

Conducting the EVALUATION of a project means systematically and objectively assessing an ongoing or completed project. The aim is to determine the relevance and level of achievement of project objectives, development effectiveness, efficiency, impact and sustainability. Evaluations also provide valuable lessons and feedback to improve the project's deliverables2.

Based on that, a project's QUALITY AND EVALUATION PLAN is a project-specific plan that describes the activities, standards, tools and processes necessary to achieve quality in the delivery of a project. It helps tracking and controlling the project while supporting the development of suitable solutions in case unexpected things occur. It also both defines the approach to take in order to ensure the quality of the project's deliverables according to the project's target group and goals, but also highlights other management processes which influence deliverable quality, such as risk management.

As such, the Quality and Evaluation Plan is to be referenced to CONSISTENTLY throughout the project in order to monitor and control the level of quality of the project's deliverables and to support their improvement.

2.1. What do Quality Management & Assurances Cover?

This technical activity concerning quality assurance is based on the contents and definition of management aspects and detailed Output descriptions, framed in the Project "Basket for All", approved by the Erasmus+ Small Scale Partnership in the field of Sport, for the period 2023-2024, and lasting 12 months.

The proposal aims to carry out the quality assurance of Basket for All, through an on-going monitoring – evaluation - quality approach.

The Quality and Evaluation Plan pursues the following goals:

- Define and develop an Evaluation plan. The evaluation will be a key tool for the identification of possible deviations in the project development, for the management adjustment and amendments, and useful to improve the quality and relevance of the project's results.

- Ensure the achievement of the general Basket for All objectives and goals.





- Guarantee that programmed actions (executions), results and direct impacts generated are measured through a battery of indicators along Basket for All delivery.

- Ensure that the deliverables and Outputs are suitable and high-quality.

The Quality and Evaluation Plan will define the evaluation questions and the evaluation criteria, including criteria to assess the quality of deliverables, the methodology to answer the evaluation questions (monitoring and evaluation indicators), the tools to obtain and manage the information, and the working plan to carry out the on-going evaluation.

The Quality and Evaluation Plan therefore covers the following aspects:

- It describes the project objectives and the quality expectations.
- It describes the evaluation objectives.
- It describes the evaluation methods and delivery.
- It defines quality management roles and responsibilities.
- It identifies the applicable quality standards.
- It describes procedures for risk management.

2.2 Quality Assurances

It is important to understand that while the successful completion of this project is an important goal within itself for all 3 project partners, it is also intended to be a means for a further wider goal: to continue the path of EU Erasmus+ projects into the future. In order to realize the planned activities in the highest quality with the equal contribution of our partners, we have set 4 parameters for our project management approach.

1) Quality in Administrative & Financial Management: We strongly believe that effective management of administrative and financial issues throughout the entire project lifetime will bring success in reaching the desired transformation in project target groups. We already had detailed meetings with our partners during the planning stage of the project application where we mutually shared all ideas in detail; we also distributed intentions and related responsibilities among our partnership consortium for a clear understanding of the paths that will be followed. With such already reached common understandings being an important asset, BIDEV will put together the project administrative and financial management guidelines which will enable all partners to follow the same format for the official documentation of the project implementation phase. These guidelines will involve detailed activity plans, expected impacts, budget allocations for partners and supportive documents for the final reporting stage. E-mail (and whatsapp) lists for constant communication including all project key people will be created.



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Project management (and cooperation) platforms such as Project Drive File Platform to collect the documents in the most transparent and efficient way will also be made available. In addition to such management facilitation platforms, bilateral partnership agreements will be undertaken to create binding conditions among EACEA – BIDEV – Partners which will also serve as efficient progress control mechanisms as we proceed and operational 'tickets' will be clearly traced and managed by a program of the likes of Monday. Regular online meetings to talk managerial issues and online reporting meetings will be held with the participation of assigned managers by partners as necessary and as frequently as necessary.

2) Quality in Field Studies & Activities: As our project will involve various international and local activities, and since all 3 partners take pride in doing their work as well as possible, we will give high importance to effectively realize all activities in the light of common quality standard requirements. As our Bulgarian partners – SCS have previous experience in the coordination of EU-funded projects before, proposition of quality standards will be done by them after Kick Off Meeting. Klatovy has already partnered in some EU-funded projects and is quickly accumulating the required general knowledge; they are currently putting together their first project that they will be leading.

And BIDEV, although they do not have much previous EU-funded project experience, their trustees do bring together vast professional experience from related fields in sports which do require the highest quality work standards and outcomes, so we are confident that they will easily adjust.... The selection of proper profile of the target groups for international and local activities will be equal responsibility of consortium and carefully approached, as well as preparation for all activities will be done by key qualified staff within each partner organisation.

<u>3) Quality in Dissemination of Project Results</u>: We are all aware that the visibility of the project and dissemination of the results is certainly as important as the implementation of the planned activities. Therefore, the dissemination and visibility strategies will be almost continuously realised throughout the entire 12 months action process. After our project's approval, the design of project corporate items (logo, project affiche, roll up etc.) will be designed by BIDEV. The Project website will be created by BIDEV and management of the website with project results will be ensured for min. 3 years after the project lifetime. The design of the Dissemination & PR Guideline (covering the titles such as usage of obligatory logos, target group of dissemination activities, dissemination channels etc.) will be the responsibility of Klatovy, our Czech partners. The creation of project social media channels for awareness raising activities will done by BK Klatovy because of their accumulated experience in such matters, and regular updates will be provided by all partner organizations. A dissemination team will be created and each organization will assign 1 PR Responsible of their organizations. This dissemination team will have its own submeetings if necessary.

Intellectual property rights concerning everything produced within the Project will be open source under EACEA frameworks. With full confidence of the quality of such content as



planned, BIDEV plans to utilise them into the future way beyond the closure of the Project by placing them in the service of all interested stakeholders anywhere and everywhere. (The website will be preserved and incorporated into the BIDEV website under the 'Projects' section) Project deliverables will be further disseminated through related works of entities like the Turkish National Olympic Committee, the Turkish Basketball Federation, The Turkish Basketball Coaches Association and others, with whom BIDEV has a close working relationship with.

<u>4) Quality in Evaluation of Achieved Results</u>: In order to monitor (and maintain) the quality in achieved results, we believe that each single action needs to be assessed in the light of the quality standards defined right at the beginning during the Kick-Off Meeting. One of the project results will be a training module consisting of International Training Course Program and methods to be used by basketball coaches to highlight the empowering and inclusive dimension of basketball for youth with fewer opportunities. Expert coaches from each organization will work on the creation of this module, while the implementation of training course and mentoring the local implementations will be done in 3 countries.

As the related phase(s) will cover almost 6 months of the implementation process, evaluation meetings will be done on a regular basis throughout these 6 months. Besides, regular assessments will be conducted over the reached impact related to designated target groups. Communication is key - international and local meetings will be held by national project teams and overall assessment meetings will be done by project managers. SCS, our Bulgarian partner will create the 'local activities evaluation templates' that will be used to follow the evaluation and monitoring methods. BK Klatovy will create the dissemination reports template and BIDEV will create international meetings + Administrative & Financial management templates to facilitate a systematic handling of all procedures.

In parallel to 4 parameters, online working documents will be created by BIDEV to ensure the efficient time management of planned activities to control these activities' preparation – realization – reporting phases. Specific deadlines and foreseen dates of regular online meetings will be set in a timely fashion with the common decision of the project consortium.

2.3. Quality Tools

The primary quality tool for the development of the project will the Monitoring and Evaluation Grid, which comprises all project's milestones, activities and responsibilities of each partner. This will compose a tool to easily track the project's deliverables and activities, and function like a comprehensive checklist that will be transmitted by the project coordinator, to be followed by all the partners.

Additionally, secondary instruments and resources such as structured questionnaires, surveys and interviews will be used as suitable in different stages of the project's development to ensure the compliance with the project's goals.





A risk assessment document will be attached to monitor and prevent potential risks and hazards to the project and will be a crucial tool in the project's success. Such risk assessment document is already prepared in Administrative and Financial Guideline to be aware of the fundamentals of the project.

2.4 Aspects to Evaluate the Quality and Evaluation Focus

- Impact: we will measure the overall effect on the direct and indirect target group using quantitative and qualitative data.
- Sustainability: are all activities and products being developed under a sustainable framework?
- Efficiency: are the obtained results based on the foreseen ones?
- Effectiveness: results are evaluated based on the means used and activity
- Relevance: reviewing the proposal with regard to meeting recognized needs identified by the target groups.

Our evaluation focus can be list as below:

- Partnership communication.
- Impact on both project partners & the target group.
- Effectiveness of project management & reporting.
- Partnership sustainability.
- Quality of systems, outputs and processes.
- Impact of dissemination activities and project evaluation visibility will occur after each significant point in the project. For example: Local events
- Project management and communication assessment to take place after each partnership meeting
- Quality in products will be assessed during the development and finally after the finalization of each the key Output "The training module"
- Impact on the target group will be assessed after each activity involving them

- get the chance to enhance their local partners network for the sustainable dialogue for basketball

2) Sport Coaches / Trainers

2.1 Expected Impact on Coaches / Trainers in Short Term:

- They will find chance to sustain the further cooperation and enhance the dialogue between their colleagues to promote basketball as a tool for social empowerment



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3) Youth with fewer opportunities

A lot of youngsters miss the opportunity of getting involved in sports and benefiting from the advantages sports can add to their personal development. Youngsters with lesser opportunities is not narrowly defined in this sense in order to cover a wide range of lesser opportunities including but not limited to any related situation including but not limited to having no coaches/teachers or incapable coaches/teachers, no equipment, no facilities, no opportunities, parents pressure and limitations, financial pressure and limitations, physical capacities (youngsters that might be shorter or slower than their peers are usually excluded, let alone those who have a little extra weight) ...

3.1 Expected Impact on Youth In Short Term:

The number of young people with fewer opportunities between 16-18 years old who participated in Local Sport Activities, approx. 60 in 3 countries, will learn how sport can be helpful for them to realize their potential and activate their participation in our societies
by participating in local sport activities, they will find open space to interact with their peers by using the language of basketball

3.2 In Medium & Long Term:

- by participating in local sport activities, they will learn how basketball can provide also learning and empowering dimension for their whole lives

- by coming together with role models and sport celebrities, they will find chance to learn from the reallife experiences and reflect on how sport and education dimensions can be proceeded together

- by designing the awareness raising activities, their sense of active participation and citizenship will be stimulated, and their communication and digital competences will be raised.


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Here there are 3 samples of dissemination campaigns to inspire further beneficiaries to highlight the social aspect of basketball:
